Ever since the season began, and ever since we got invited to the DIII NWBA National Tournament, we had three objectives going into it: win the championship, represent the greater Triangle area with dignity and class, and earn the respect and recognition of our competition and the NWBA as well. While we did not accomplish all of our goals, we managed to complete two of them.

We were the seven seed at Nationals. On the first day of the tournament, we came out victorious in our first two games, beating the ten seed Brooklyn Nets and the two seed Houston Hotwheels. Our win against the Hotwheels drew the attention of the NWBA; according to an <u>article</u> written by Pasha Zolfaghari of the NWBA, our win against the Hotwheels was "the most impressive upset" of the first day of the tournament.

On the second day of Nationals, we played the RHI Pacers in the final four. We fought valiantly, but ultimately came up short against them. (The Pacers went on to play in and win the finals against the Harrisonburg Cardinals.)

On the last day of Nationals, we played the one seed Connecticut Spokebenders for third place. We defeated them soundly, earning third place for the first time ever.

Additionally, three of our players received the honor of being named to the 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, and 3<sup>rd</sup> All-Tournament teams. Tee Foster was part of the 1<sup>st</sup> All-Tournament team; Chris Rivera was part of the 2<sup>nd</sup> All-Tournament team; Miles Hill was part of the 3<sup>rd</sup> All-Tournament team.
